CHARACTERS

The Irregulars: (teens)

WIGGINS: street kid, mid to late teens, leader of the Irregulars, smart

POCKETS: young girl, early teens, light-fingered, key member

CHEN: young street kid, early to mid teens, likes to invent possibly useful detective tools

TINY: street kid, mid to late teens, tall/stocky ie *not* tiny, artistic

ASH: youngest, pre-teen girl, small of stature, chimney sweep, Tiny's sister

ELIZA MAYHEW: young girl, mid teens, joins Irregulars to find her missing grandfather

The Good Guys: (adults)

SHERLOCK HOLMES: famous detective, assumed dead after fall from Reichenbach Falls DR. WATSON: associate of Holmes and best friend, decides to work with the Irregulars INSPECTOR LESTRADE: skeptical policeman; reluctantly works with the Irregulars

MRS HUDSON: Holmes' older landlady

RICHARD MAYHEW: Eliza's grandfather; amateur detective with a past **PEABODY:** friend of Mayhew trying to keep him safe from his past

POLICEMEN: members of police assisting Lestrade

MOTHER AND FATHER: Pocket's parents

PASSERSBY: 3 men and a woman passing on the street

MAYOR'S DAUGHTER: Mayor's young daughter who has been kidnapped, 6-8 years old

THE BAD GUYS: (adults)

MORRIS WIGGINS: wicked father of Wiggins

MORIARITY: criminal mastermind

O'REILLY: accomplice of Morris Wiggins (Henchman) **ARTHUR:** accomplice of Morris Wiggins (Henchman)

GUARD: guard in the prison

PARTS COMBINED WITH OTHERS:

Mayhew/guard/policeman/Father Holmes/passerby/henchman Arthur Morris Wiggins/Moriarty/passerby Peabody/passerby/henchman O'Reilly/policeman Mrs Hudson/passerby/Mother

PRINCIPAL ROLES:

Wiggins, Pockets, Tiny, Dr Watson, Inspector Lestrade

KEY SECONDARY ROLES:

Ash, Chen, Eliza, Morris Wiggins,
